AMDOCS POLICY ON CONFLICT MINERALS

Amdocs is committed to corporate responsibility and to ensuring the protection of human rights in all its operations and in its global supply chain.

Amdocs is committed to complying with the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High Risk-Areas, as well as the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission's Conflict Minerals Disclosure Rule. These rules require publicly traded companies to report annually the presence in its products of conflict minerals (Tin, Tungsten, Tantalum and Gold, or "3TG") originating in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or adjoining countries. Through this commitment, Amdocs seeks to help identify, reduce and ultimately eliminate the use of conflict minerals that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and surrounding countries, generating violence and human rights violations.

Amdocs does not directly source conflict minerals. Yet, through the purchase of IT equipment for internal use and integration of third-party communication equipment for projects that we are engaged in, we make sure to source materials and equipment from suppliers that share our values and comply with all applicable legal standards and requirements.

Through Amdocs Supplier Code of Conduct and Amdocs EHS' Contract Requirements, our suppliers of products containing conflict minerals shall:

- commit to identifying, reducing and eliminating the use in materials supplied to Amdocs of conflict minerals that don't comply with the applicable legal standards and requirements;
- work with their own suppliers and supply chain to determine the source of any products containing conflict minerals supplied to Amdocs;
- establish their own policies, due diligence and management systems to reasonably assure that the
 minerals they utilize are validated as 'conflict free', and communicate this expectation to their
 suppliers; and
- cooperate with Amdocs in its efforts to comply with any applicable reporting requirements of governmental agencies and customers upon Amdocs' request.
